Midweek Small Group Discussion:

Priorities — Matthew 6:19-34

According to Matthew 4:19, one quality of a disciple is "following Jesus." In what way(s) have you followed Jesus in the past week?

Read Matthew 6:19-34. Allow 2 minutes for silent reflection after the reading.

Describe the alternative to storing up treasures on earth. (verses 19-21)

Describe the alternative to a dark life. (verses 22-23)

Describe the alternative to a monetary master. (verse 24)

In what ways do you see anxiety and worry impacting the Bay Area? Have you succumbed to the anxiety and worry of our culture? How is it impacting you?

How would you define "the kingdom" that Jesus refers to in verse 33?

The word "first" in Matthew 6:33 could also be worded as "Above all else," "foremost," or "chiefly." Reflect on the narrative of your life. What has been your chief or foremost pursuit throughout your life? Has it been a search for an object such as a large home or a big 401K?

Has it been a search to fill a void such as acceptance or approval? Has it been a striving for a particular title or status in life?

How does a person actually and practically "seek" the Kingdom? How does it differ from a game of "Hide 'n Seek"? How might it be similar?

In verse 34, what is Jesus saying here? "Do not worry about tomorrow..."
