Romans 12:1-8

What were your key takeaways from Sunday's sermon about Spiritual gifts?

Read Romans 12:1-8.

- Do you have any questions or insights you want to share with the group?

What do you think it means for a gift to be a "grace" given to each of us? (verse 6) How would you describe the difference between a Spiritual gift and a talent?

Although we have different gifts, what is the one thing we have in common? (verse 5)

- Why would it be helpful to remember what we each have in common as you implement your unique gift(s)?
- At the time Paul wrote, there was tension between Jews and Gentiles. How might Paul's words on Spiritual gifts have been a challenge for them to put into practice?

Verse 1 urges you to offer your body as a living sacrifice. How does that change the way you think about using your Spiritual gift?

Earlier in this sermon series, the point was made that the Spirit gives us power for daily living. In what ways does the Holy Spirit's power impact the effectiveness of your Spiritual gift?

How does verse 2 set up or connect with Paul's teaching on Spiritual gifts?

It is no coincidence that Paul follows his writings on Spiritual gifts with words on love. (Romans 12:9; 1 Corinthians 13) What are dangers and consequences of using your gifts for selfish, unloving purposes?

At some point this week, how could you exercise your Spiritual gift for the betterment of the Body of Christ?
